
Kia Ora, Hello Everybody,

PASTOR'S REFLECTION

We are all well aware of how everyday life changed during the lockdown, and even under Alert Level 2 so much of what we used to take for granted is still changing. When we will get back to regular Sunday services is still to be finalised, but even then, things will look different. Firstly, our premises (like those everywhere) will need general cleaning after many weeks of accumulated dust; and then there will be specific cleaning in readiness for our meetings. Please pray for the Parish Council as important decisions need to be made, and for other groups that use our premises; the timing of their return is also important.



During the lockdown, my car saw little use. Early on I started it and drove short distances just to keep the battery charged, but increasingly the battery sounded 'dodgy' and the car became harder to start. A few starts with jumper leads were necessary. Eventually,

however, despite my best efforts, the battery 'died' and all I got was the unpleasant fast clicking sound that told me what I actually knew: I needed a new battery! Once fitted, I have of course, experienced no further problems (the car fires into life), even after sitting for several days. Like many mechanical things, a car is meant to be used regularly. With careful driving and good maintenance most modern cars are very reliable; but problems can arise when used only occasionally, and not only with the battery. In short, today's engines are meant to be driven!

I think there are parallels here with the use of our giftings: they are meant to be used all the time to bless the Body of Christ. To neglect them or use them only as the whim takes us, means the body suffers and we may feel frustrated too. What are the things you know you do that help others and bless the body? I heard this week of one of our members that has been busy not only phoning around but also writing and posting cards of encouragement – fantastic! Another made contact somewhat out of the blue, with Mother's Day greetings for Celia. What a blessing! Then there are those who keep an eye on our premises and keep the lawns and grounds tidy, and so on. Different people using their different gifts to bless and help others. All gifts are 'spiritual gifts' because they are of the Holy Spirit, even though we tend to think of spiritual gifts as solely the demonstrative, supernatural or sign gifts. The point is, if everyone is using what God has given them we are built-up and encouraged. Let's never tire of doing those things we know are personally fulfilling and that bless others.
