FOCUSING PSALM: PSALM 11

David is literally taking refuge in God in this Psalm at the Temple and rejecting his advisors' advice to flee in the midst of panic. They saw only frightening circumstances and crumbling foundations — but David knew God. Verse 3 seems apt given we are now said to be living in a 'new normal' world of pandemic, climate, and other fears. From verse 4 on David affirms God's sovereignty and absolute justice. So should we.

In the LORD I take refuge.
How then can you say to me:
"Flee like a bird to your mountain.
For look, the wicked bend their bows;
they set their arrows against the strings
to shoot from the shadows
at the upright in heart.
When the foundations are being destroyed,
what can the righteous do?"

The LORD is in his holy temple; the LORD is on his heavenly throne.
He observes everyone on earth; his eyes examine them.
